Killara High School upgrade

A project is underway at Killara High School to deliver 17 new permanent teaching spaces, as well as upgrades to some of the school's existing core facilities.

Progress summary

The design of the school upgrade is being finalised.

Enabling works including the tree removal and the demolition of the House building were completed during the summer holidays.

The main works contract has been awarded and the school upgrade is expected to be completed by mid 2020.

Next steps

Main works will commence in March to enable the construction of the new building along Churchill Road.

During this time, we will be working collaboratively with the school community and neighbours to ensure that disruptions to the community are minimised.

We are committed to sharing information as the project progresses.



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Frequently asked questions

What works will take place in March?

The contractor will prepare the work area so that construction can begin. The contractor will:

- erect construction fencing
- install the site office and work sheds
- deliver equipment

Following site establishment initial excavation and earthworks will begin.

Is there an impact to current school operations?

No. School operations during Term 1 will continue as usual.

What steps will be taken to control noise and dust impacts?

Hoarding and shade cloth will be erected to reduce noise and dust impacts on the school and our neighbours. Dust from demolition and construction works will be hosed down with water as required.

How will traffic be managed?

Construction vehicle movements and deliveries will be scheduled outside of peak school operation times.

Traffic management will be in place where required to manage vehicles entering and exiting the site.

How will the removal of hazardous materials be managed?

The health, safety and well-being of students, staff, visitors and our neighbours is our highest priority.

During the summer holidays, asbestos materials were removed from the House. The work was carried out by a licensed accredited asbestos removal contractor in accordance with the Department of Education's Asbestos Management Plan and Safe Work NSW requirements. The area has been cleared and poses no threat. Air monitoring and site fencing will remain in place.
