Information for Year 8 (2017) students and parents

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Stage 5 mandatory requirements

In Years 9 and 10, students are required to study the following mandatory courses for the completion of Stage 5 and progression into Stage 6:

- English (*500 hours)
- Mathematics (*500 hours)
- Science (*500 hours)
- Australian History & Geography (incorporating Civics & Citizenship) (*400 hours)
- Personal Development, Health, Physical Education (PD/H/PE) (*300 hours)

These are the combined NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) and Department of Education minimum requirements for government schools when providing curriculum. (7-10)

In addition to the mandatory courses, students are required to study elective courses.

At Killara High School, students must study:

• THREE ELECTIVE courses in Year 9

and maintain their study of

• TWO of these courses in Year 10

to meet the NESA requirements for Stage 5 which is shown on the Record of Student Achievement (RoSA) credential.

Mandatory requirements

The NESA requirements for the completion of Stage 5:

- In Years 7 10, students study a variety of courses which are mandatory.
- Students must meet the mandatory hours of study for each course.
- Students are required to apply themselves with diligence and sustained effort in each course.
- At Killara High School, some mandatory courses are completed in Stage 4. These are Visual Art and Music, Languages and Technology courses.

The RoSA

In Year 10, school based assessment of mandatory and elective courses occurs, and grades based on these assessments are submitted to the NESA, which accredit students with a Record of Student Achievement (RoSA).

The RoSA is an ongoing and cumulative record which students can add to as they progress through to the completion of their schooling from Years 9-12.

What to consider when choosing courses

ABILITIES

include courses in which you are capable of doing well

INTERESTS AND MOTIVATION

- include courses which interest you
- include subject areas which you want to study
- **do not** be tempted to include courses just because your friends like them

CAREER ASPIRATIONS AND NEEDS

- if you are unsure, talk to people who have the experience and expertise to guide you – teachers, parents, siblings, senior students
- remember that the courses you include you may be studying for the next two years
- the only Stage 5 courses that are required as prerequisites for Stage 6 courses are the Continuers Languages courses

Course selection process

- Student Information sessions
- Parent Information Evening
- Home Group discussions

Students then complete:

- The LEMON form Course Selections
- Their selection online, on edval.com, with courses entered in order of preference, by midnight Thursday 22 June
- A printout of the online selection, signed by a parent/carer

Both these forms are to be submitted to the A Block Accounts Office no later than Friday 23 June 2017

YEAR 9 2017 into Year 10 2018 Elective Courses Review HOW TO COMPLETE THE WEBCHOICES ONLINE ELECTIVE COURSES REVIEW

Year 10 students in 2018 are required to complete **TWO** elective courses. Currently students in Year 9 are undertaking **THREE** elective courses. As a consequence, students will be required to prioritise the maintenance of each of their current elective courses by completing the Webchaices online Elective Courses Review. It is important when completing the Elective Courses Review that you prioritise all three electives currently being studied and that the first elective nominated is your **most** preferred elective and that the third elective is your **least** preferred elective and should be nominated as a reserve. You will not be able to nominate new subjects because you will not meet the required number of hours for Stage 5 as determined by the Board of Studies. Please remember that electives in Stage 5 are designed for students to participate in non-core subjects in which they have an interest and enjoy.

The Elective Courses Review information will determine the pattern of study for Year 10 2018 and will be based on timetabling requirements. The school will endeavour to accommodate a student's first two choices.

Remember, your choices will not influence your opportunities for senior subject selections in Year 11, with the exception of Continuer Languages Courses.

- · You must choose a subject in all spaces.
- Please select in order of Priority. The first of the 2 Priorities is your most preferred choice for your electives and the subject you would like most to do. The Reserve is the elective you would least like to continue
- When you have completed the Elective Course Review on the web choices page you
 must print a copy. This copy <u>MUSI</u> be signed and dated by both you and a
 parent/caregiver. You must then return the signed form to the box in the Head
 Teacher Secondary Studies' office on or before Friday 13 August 2017.
- Note: You can go on the web site <u>https://web.edval.com.au/mysubjects</u> and change your selections as many times as you wish until midnight <u>Thursday 10 August, 2017</u>. After the cut off time the review is final and cannot be changed.
