Video Conferencing Experience



I believe the Video Conferencing (VC) between group 2 of Killara High, 7A class and St Ives Public School went particularly well because of many factors considered by the group.

Firstly, we prepared speeches and activities that we shared using a conferencing application called "Bridget". The theme chosen to base the VC on was "heroes", which is currently the unit of study for Year 7 English. To interest our audience, which comprised students of Year 3 and 4, we made an Active Studio page which contained pictures of well recognizable villains and heroes. To the directions of the hosts, the other school matched the characters. We then discussed the qualities of heroes – an educational benefit for all.

Finally, I believe the organizational skills that the members of the team demonstrated were highly influential in the success of the VC. Video Conferencing has been an experience that should be accessible to all students across all years.
