Excellence in School Certificate Results Again!

Killara High School Year 10 students have excelled once again in the NSW School Certificate, achieving results which are considerably above the State average in all courses.

There has been a significant shift of students into the top band in the English literacy examination this year in a comparison to previous years. Killara dominates the top two bands with a significantly higher percentage of students achieving either band 5 or 6 when compared with State-wide achievement levels.

This level of excellence is not isolated to our students' literacy skills. Results in Mathematics, Science and Computing Skills replicate this pattern with students at Killara heavily represented in the top bands. In Australian History, Civics and Citizenship Killara students achieved results in Bands 5 and 6 which exceed the State results by 20%. Our students are being wellprepared for a technological future with 96% of students achieving wither highly competent or competent in the Computing Skills course.

A comparative analysis reveals that in every course examined in the School Certificate, *at least* 50% of Killara High School students achieve results in the top two bands. This is a testament to the academic focus and hard work of our students but also to the quality teaching and learning experiences offered by staff in all Key Learning Areas.

In addition to this, the marked improvements evident in the 2009 results exemplify the success of new programs developed as part of a professional learning focus on student engagement over the past two years.

Congratulations to all Year 10 students on your impressive results and to the hard-working teachers who continue to inspire their students towards even greater success!

The Advantages We Sometimes Take for Granted

Killara High School is a busy place to work and learn. Since I returned last Thursday the pace of activity and change is very apparent. In six months there have been many developments thanks to the advocacy of students, staff and parents.

One advantage of working at Killara that I take for granted too often is the teaching and leadership capacities of my colleagues. I take this opportunity to thank Ms Glenda Robinson and her executive team for their work in leading and managing Killara High School over the last six months. I am very grateful for their commitment and talents in pursuing the development agendas in close consultation with students and parents. Their wise guidance of students, particularly our 2009 HSC cohort, is easilv overlooked when one enters a school full of students who are welcoming, happy and willing participants in learning. I also wish to thank the student leaders, the P&C executive and the multitudes of parent volunteers for their tireless support of the school.

I am glad to be home and back working at Killara. Living and working in another country very different from Australia is a rich and sometimes intense learning experience. It prompts personal reflection of our values and assumptions, as well as an appreciation of services in health, education and justice which we take for granted and perhaps grumble about too often. And the capacity of people to live happily regardless of simplicity and privation is a strong counterpoint to the materialism of our own 'rich' culture.

I found my work with the Indonesian Ministry of National Education stimulating and on occasions, very challenging. I've learnt much about another culture, about government, bureaucracy and the issues facing a developing nation. But there is a universal aspect of education and schooling that is heart warming and reassuring. One evening in Gorontalo, Nth Sulawesi, a long, long way from Jakarta, I was privileged to be among guests entertained by students from a local senior high school. The music and dance of these happy and energetic young people brought my thoughts back to Killara.

The culture and sounds might have been different but the exhilaration and joy of the students at the end of the performances was pure youth without cultural boundaries. I might as well have been sitting in the Kerrabee Centre for the atmosphere of optimism and pride in personal achievement that the students created.
