Here in North Sydney we live with the physical reminders of the 'Great War': the simple and elegant cenotaph in St Leonards Park, the captured field gun at the other end of the park, and the traditional and very moving Tramway Workers Anzac Statue in Anzac Park. Inside out schools and churches there are honour rolls, plaques and stained glass windows honouring the memory of those who went to war. These are public memorials.

But there are also personal reminders of that war – postcards, letters, medals, badges, buttons and souvenirs that belonged to relative who served. This book explores the impact of the "Great War' on North Sydney and provides a context for understanding the significance of those memorials and mementoes. It explores the stories of a local community caught up in a war on the other side of the world.
