NAPLAN Tests for Years 7 and 9 in 2010

Parent and community members may be aware that the Australian Education Union and the NSW Teachers Federation have placed a moratorium on the implementation and administration of NAPLAN tests for Year 7 and 9 in 2010 in order to stop the publication of league tables. A meeting of NSW Teachers Federation members at this school has endorsed that moratorium and members have indicated that they do not intend to implement or supervise the tests this year. I have canvassed all members of staff at a Staff meeting and at this time no member of staff have indicated that they are prepared to implement or supervise the tests. The Department of Education and Training have indicated that the Tests will proceed with external supervision if necessary. At this stage, I have no information on how this would occur. Hence, all students in Years 7 and 9 need to attend school as normal on the days of the previously planned NAPLAN tests, Tuesday May 11th to Thursday May 13th inclusive. Normal classes will occur unless the tests are conducted by external supervisors. I will advise all parents of any updated information.

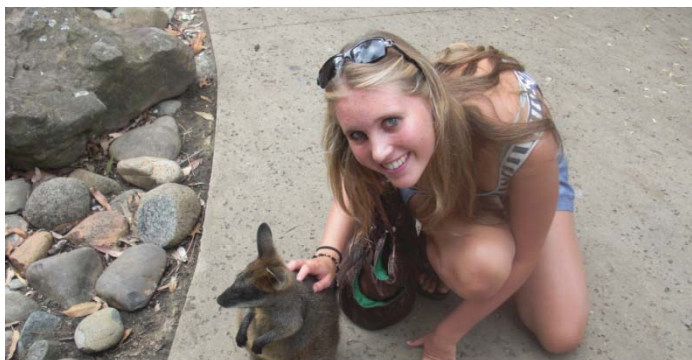
Ten Great Months with Great Experiences – An exchange student's story

Every German associates Australia with surfing and fortunately for me I was able to try it.

Another travel highlight was the recent trip to Hamilton Island with my other host family. Ever since I was little I had dreamed about snorkeling in the Great Barrier Reef and it was even better than in my dreams. I especially enjoyed seeing the fabulous underwater world of Australia's coast.

Going to school in Australia was certainly a great experience and as a tourist you would never come close to the real culture of the country.

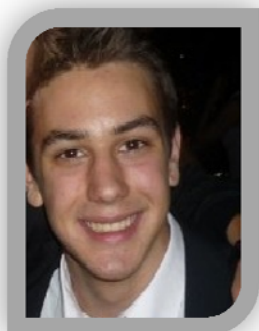

Important Information MyZone fares and tickets Student travel passes

Dear Principal,

The NSW Government is introducing an easier and simpler fare and ticket structure for public transport starting on 18 April 2010 called MyZone.

The School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) and the concessions currently available for students will not be affected.

However, school students travelling outside the valid hours of their school pass will need to buy a concession MyTrain, MyBus, MyFerry or MyMulti ticket.

Public transport infrastructure continues to improve and so we are introducing a new fare structure than can be implemented using existing technology, gates and tickets.

MyBus, MyFerry and MyMulti MyZone tickets can be purchased at selected official resellers displaying the MyZone PrePay signage from 3 April 2010. MyTrain tickets and other MyZone tickets will be available from select transport ticket offices and vending machines from 18 April 2010.

The NSW Government is undertaking an extensive public information campaign to help commuters understand the MyZone fare changes and purchase the correct ticket type that best suits their travel needs.
