What Keeps Us Going: Goodwill and Service to Others

The expectations of schools in the 21st century are much greater than they were a century ago, or even 40 years ago. Since its establishment on the Koola Ave site in 1970, Killara High School has grown and adapted to changing circumstances and conditions. Flexibility in the face of challenge has been a hallmark of this school and its community. Simultaneously there has been an unwavering commitment to the care, growth and learning of young people. This has in turn been underpinned by goodwill and voluntary service on the part of staff, parents and students.

Most of the enrichment opportunities provided to young people at this school are through the voluntary efforts of staff and parents. Music, sport, excursions, tours, evening performances, musicals, drama ensembles, vacation HSC classes, expeditions and camps all occur because of the interest, dedication and selflessness of staff and parents at this school. Literally, school as we know it would not exist without the voluntary service and goodwill from many. Money doesn't 'buy' an ethos of selfless service.

At a staff meeting last week I started to thank those who I'd noted had volunteered to give up their own time to help students or support them in various activities. The list in my head grew as I stood before the meeting and saw the faces of those who I'd not initially remembered. And of course there are those who go about their work quietly, unobserved in their care, kindness and dedication to the welfare and learning of others. Then there are the parents who contribute their time and expertise through music ensemble organisation, uniform shop, canteen, committees, lobbying campaigns, social functions, working bees, expeditions, tours, sporting visits and student exchange programs.

40 years after its establishment, what sets this school apart from many? Some might say HSC results, others reputation, but these are manifestations of a deeper ethos, one that is founded on goodwill, care, respect for one another, the ideal of equity and a sense of community service.

There will probably be some testing times ahead in public education when competing interests generate division, ferment adversarial relationships and the rhetoric of conflict becomes all too prevalent. Regardless of imperfection and shortcomings, this school overflows with advantage. It has a particular responsibility to strengthen and champion the values that underpin public education and the concept of public service. Killara is well placed to weather 'storms' of discontent while ever we preserve our commitment to the ethos that has served this community well for four decades. May the next 40 years at Killara lessen self interest and strengthen the traditions and foundations of cooperative endeavour, respect, service and goodwill.

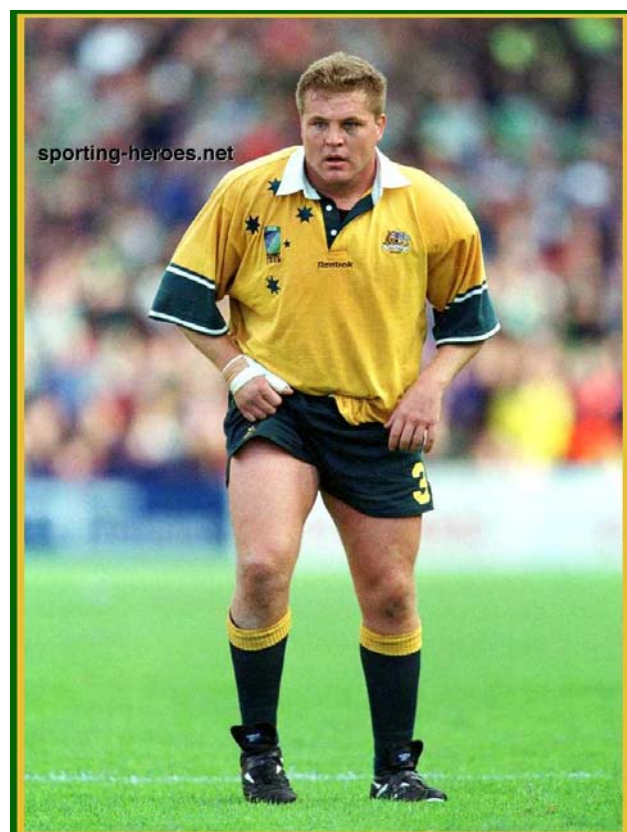

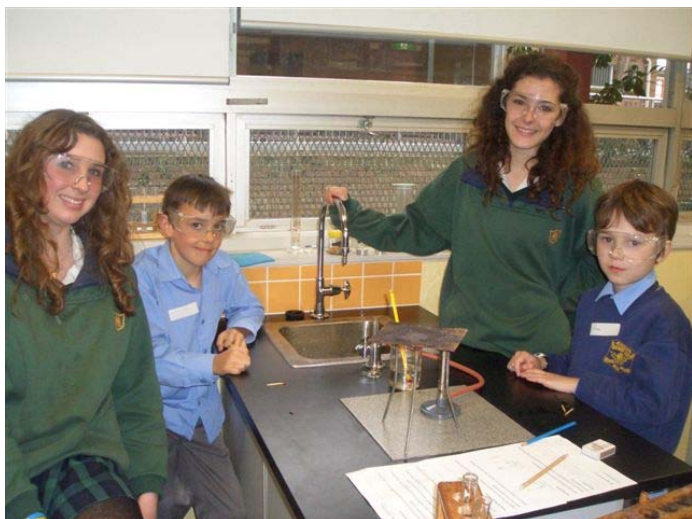
The High School Challenge for Year 3 Students
