Legal Aid Talk for Legal Studies Students

On 5th November, Year 11 Legal Studies classes attended a presentation by Matt Dimich, a lawyer employed by Legal Aid to represent children in a court of law.

We were taught the various levels of jurisdiction which apply to minors when they have committed an offence. Matt referenced the different severity levels of offences which minors commit ranging from explicit language to murder being the most serious. We were also taught that a common reason for arrest of youths results from young offenders answering back to police officers. As a result an individual can turn what would have been a fine, into an arrest and receive a criminal record for assault.

We learned about the importance of knowing our rights and the resources and services available. He educated us about the importance of Legal Aid and how anybody under the age of 18 is automatically eligible to access the service.

Overall Matt taught us a lot of useful information that will help us not only with our Legal Studies course but with our overall lives.

Year 11 Food Technology Excursion

In Week 6 this term, the Year 11 Food Technology class made a trip to Brasserie Bread, Botany, to discover how an organisation in the Australian Food Industry operates and how to make beautiful bread!



Brasserie Bread is an artisan bakery that produces and supplies an award-winning range of artisan bread, pastries & cakes to over 400 top restaurants, hotels, cafés and delis across Sydney, Melbourne and the ACT.

The students were treated to a bread baking class where Matt, our trainer, talked to us about how yeast works, the unique properties of sourdough bread, and taught us some tricks for making a plaited baguette, and some scrumptious pizza scrolls!



We then took a tour of the bakery where we learned more about what Brasserie Bread does and the products they make. The students learned about factors of the business such as Quality Assurance, product development, customer influences and the impacts a business like Brasserie Bread has on the environment, society and the economy.

Matt finished the tour by awarding a couple of the students with title 'The Best Plaited Baguette Baker'! (It was quite a difficult task!)
