## Year 7 Camp

Killara High School's newest group of students had barely settled into the routine of high school life before they had to pack their bags and were whisked away to Vision Valley for the school camp.

Students were able to participate in a range of exciting activities, the most popular being ones that involved leaping from platforms into thin air, swinging at high speed while suspended from a rope, or anything that involved getting wet and muddy.

Other activities promoted team-building, cooperative behaviour and problem solving skills. Overall students said that participating in the activities allowed them to gain confidence by completing tasks that took them outside their normal comfort zone. It was most pleasing to see how many students were prepared to assist their peers when they needed help in completing a challenge.

Many students commented that going away to camp gave them the opportunity to get to know their classmates better and that they were able to meet many new friends. Teachers also noted that going away to camp with the students allowed them to appreciate the different abilities students could demonstrate outside a normal school environment.

Year Seven students showed particular enthusiasm when the prefects arrived to run the camp disco. The theme for the evening was "Jungle Fever", and there were plenty of outrageous costumes that created a fantastic atmosphere. Students were able to show the teachers a thing or two about how to move on the dance floor, and after two hours of solid partying everyone was ready to head back to the cabins.

On the second day of camp, the Year 7s were joined by the Year 11 Peer Support leaders. Once again students participated in the program with interest, and found the opportunity to get advice and encouragement from senior students very rewarding.

At the end of camp it was particularly pleasing to hear one of the Vision Valley team members comment that Killara High School students were one of the best behaved and enthusiastic groups that they had seen.

Finally, we would like to say a big thank you to the teachers who gave up their time to come on camp this year. These events could not occur without the dedication of so many teachers who ensure that students at Killara High School enjoy a range of varied and exciting activities to complement their education.

## **PDHPE Program**

As part of the Year 7 – 10 Personal Development, Heath and Physical Education curriculum, the PDHPE staff aim to enable your child to develop positive attitudes which will allow them to lead a healthy lifestyle. As they mature your children will be required to make decisions about the lifestyle they wish to adopt. We believe they should make these decisions based on sound knowledge. PDHPE staff will address some sensitive issues in lessons during the year. The depth of content and the amount and type of information given will be appropriate to each particular year group. These issues will include:

- Sexuality, puberty and menstruation
- Sexual health, contraception and sexually transmitted infections

- Relationships and the uses of power in a relationship
- Diversity, discrimination, harassment and vilification
- Child protection and protective strategies
- Decision making and communication
- Drug use
- Challenges and opportunities
- Accessing and assessing health information, products and services.

All programmed units are based on the mandatory Year 7–10 Personal Development, Health and Physical Education Syllabus, developed by the NSW Board of Studies. ## Youth Advisory Group on Cybersafety (VAG)

Students are invited to participate in an online consultation program - the Australian Government's Youth Advisory Group (YAG) on Cybersafety – 2012.

Internet and mobile technologies have created substantial benefits for young people, but they also expose them to a number of potential dangers, such as cyber-bullying or coming into contact with prohibited or offensive material The Government is working to increase the cybersafety of Australian children and is seeking advice from them about cybersafety issues and their online experiences. The YAG was launched by the Minister for Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy, Senator the Hon Stephen Conroy, in May 2009 and has been an excellent source of information and advice to Government on many cybersafety issues including cyberbullying, sexting and online privacy The Cybersafety Help Button and the Easy Guide to Socialising Online, which were recently launched by the Prime Minister, are both innovative cybersafety tools that were developed as a result of the advice of the YAG.

As a member of the YAG, your students would be part of up to 3,000 students from around Australia who would play a key role in developing Australia's cybersafety policy and programs. ### Problems hearing in the classroom?
