KHS-Monash Research Partnership commences 2013

What are the career plans of our students, and how do their in-school experiences contribute to shaping them? Which pathways are most appealing for which individuals, and why? These and related questions form the agenda of "STEPS": Study of Transitions and Education Pathways. We welcome back Dr Helen Watt, Associate Professor in Educational Psychology at Monash University, who is conducting the research as a priority federally funded project through the Australian Research Council.

Helen conducted a similar study at Killara High School and 2 other Sydney high schools from 1995-1998, involving Year 12 cohorts of 1999, 2000, and 2001. You can read about those research outcomes at www.stepsstudy.org. In fact, she is presently engaged in re-contacting all the earlier participants, in a unique study to find out where they are and what they are doing 14 years later!

From 2013, Year 10 students from Killara will join Year 10 students from 4 additional schools in Sydney and 6 in Melbourne in a new study, which will track students through to the end of secondary schooling, and beyond. Only studies that follow the same people over time can adequately address questions concerning youth aspirations, pathways and destinations. And, only studies which include rich attitudinal information, can find out why youth pursue particular fields of education and occupation and not others – information sorely needed by post-secondary educators, employers and policymakers.

Full information will be distributed to all parents/carers early in March – we hope you will join us in our shared endeavour!

NSW School-Based Immunisation Program

Each year NSW Ministry of Health offers the vaccines recommended by the National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) for adolescents as part of the school-based vaccination program.

In 2013 the following vaccines will be offered:

- Hepatitis B vaccine a 2 dose course for all Year 7 students who have never received a course of Hepatitis B vaccine when they were a baby.
- Varicella (Chickenpox) vaccine 1 dose for all Year 7 students who have not previously received Varicella vaccine or had chickenpox disease.
- Diphtheria, Tetanus and Pertussis (Whooping cough) vaccine - 1 booster dose. This dose was previously recommended at 15 years of age. Your child will only be offered this vaccine in Year 7.
- HPV vaccine (Human Papillomavirus) a 3
 dose course. The vaccine will be offered to Year
 7 male and female students and Year 9 male
 students as a 3-dose course over the school year.
 Students who commence HPV vaccination in
 Year 7 at school but do not complete the course
 may be offered catch-up doses at school in Year
 8.

Parent Information Kits will be sent home to parents/carers. To consent to the vaccination of their child, parents/carers are advised to read all the information provided, complete the Consent Form and return it to their child's school. Please ensure the child eats breakfast on the day of the school vaccination clinic.

Parent/carers who wish to withdraw their consent for any reason may do so in writing to the School Principal. The Procedure for withdrawal of consent is on the NSW Ministry of Health website at www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation

To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout the year where possible.

Please note that for HPV vaccine only, parents/carers must record their Medicare Number (all 10 digits and the 11th number beside the child's name) on the Consent Form, as this is required to record the student's information on the National HPV Register and for female students only, link to the National or State Cervical Screening Program.

A Record of Vaccination will be provided to each student vaccinated at the clinic. Parents *I* carers should ensure that this record is kept for future reference and should not assume that their child has been vaccinated if they do not receive this Record of Vaccination.

As part of the Year 7 – 10 Personal Development, Heath and Physical Education curriculum, the PDHPE staff aim to enable your child to develop positive attitudes which will allow them to lead a healthy lifestyle. As they mature your children will be required to make decisions about the lifestyle they wish to adopt. We believe they should make these decisions based on sound knowledge. PDHPE staff will address some sensitive issues in lessons during the year. The depth of content and the amount and type of information given will be appropriate to each particular year group. These issues will include:

- Sexuality, puberty and menstruation
- Sexual health, contraception and sexually transmitted infections
- Relationships and the uses of power in a relationship
- Diversity, discrimination, harassment and vilification
- Child protection and protective strategies

- Decision making and communication
- Drug use
- Challenges and opportunities
- Accessing and assessing health information, products and services.

All programmed units are based on the mandatory Year 7–10 Personal Development, Health and Physical Education Syllabus, developed by the NSW Board of Studies. This newsletter notice is to advise parents that these issues will be discussed in classes. Parents may wish to prepare for questions that may result from these lessons. Parents may ask that their children be withdrawn from classes involving such discussions.



The Fault in our Stars by John Green.

"This book is a work of fiction. I made it up. Neither novels nor their readers benefit from attempts to divine whether any facts hide inside a story. Such efforts attack the very idea that made-up stories can matter, which is sort of the

foundational assumption of our species. I appreciate your cooperation in this matter".......... and so begins the author's note at the beginning of the novel.

Despite the tumour-shrinking medical miracle that has brought her a few years, Hazel has never been anything but terminal, her final chapter inscribed upon diagnosis. But when a gorgeous plot twist named Augustus Waters suddenly appears at Cancer Kid Support Group, Hazel's story is about to be completely rewritten.....

".....I really liked Augustus Waters. I really, really, really liked him. I liked the way his story ended with someone else. I liked his voice. I liked that he took existentially fraught free throws.
