Parents of Students with Asthma


The recent tragic loss of a student at St Ives North Primary school after the sudden onset of an asthma attack prompts us all to reconsider our procedures and protocols.

If a student has even mild asthma they should carry their own Ventolin puffer at all times. Given the current alterations to the school, many classrooms are a good distance from the First Aid clinic, and even staffrooms. Asthma is insidious in that there is no predictability regarding the severity of an attack so it is always best to be prepared.

Staff at Killara will be renewing their training in Asthma care in order to ensure that we take all necessary precautions however high school students are encouraged to take some responsibility for their own well-being by carrying the prescribed medication. They should also be encouraged to inform a staff member immediately if they are feeling short of breath so that they can be accompanied to the clinic for observation or to seek medical help.

The Killara community of students, parents and staff would like to express their sincere condolences to the staff, students and especially, the parents, of St Ives North Primary school.

Annual Bridge Building Competition

On 6th August, we went to the Sydney Art Gallery to participate in the Aurecon Bridge Building Competition, accompanied by Ms Meaney.

This competition is about designing and constructing a bridge with a limited amount of materials so that it can support the maximum amount of weight and tension before the bridge breaks. Our bridge had to look visually appealing as well as being strong and sturdy.

The judging session lasted for 6 hours and our 'Bridge of Freedom' was ranked 5th amongst 50 other competing schools. The bridge held a mediocre 21kg, around 40KG less than the expected load (since it took Yifan's entire bodyweight without breaking the day before the judging). A point worth mentioning is that the structure of our bridge is still perfectly fine after taking the load. It failed to take more load because its balance wasn't designed well and was forced to bend sideways which increased the horizontal distance between the two sides and the connecting beams failed to hold the sides together.

Despite the slightly disappointing results, we still had lots of fun and generally had a great time. This is a rewarding experience and we'll definitely recommend others to attend this as well.

We would also like to thank all our peers and teachers who helped and supported us, making it possible for us to attend this competition.


