DEC Approved Software available for KHS Students

As part of the BYOD (Bring Your Own Device Policy) the DEC is providing access to software for students via their student portal. Mac and PC versions for some of the software are available too. Some of the software is free for students and some is provided at a reduced cost for students to purchase. At the moment Microsoft has NOT made Office available (expected soon), however Adobe has placed the following software in the Captivate 6, Creative Suite 6 Design (this includes Photoshop – extended), Premier Elements and Presenter 8.

When students go to their portal they should click on the "Learning" button and open it. Students can explore what is available and "Add to Cart" items they want to download. As part of the download process, students are required to register first, and once a verification email has been sent to them, they can access software to download.

The Technical Support Officers can help students to access the site if needed. They are located in the E block quadrangle area.

Note: It is important for students to realise that they can only download ONE copy of the software they have selected. Students need to think carefully before downloading and installing software on a machine.

Ballet style 'flats', Vans and canvas shoes with and without laces (see images below) do not meet basic safety standards for the playground and practical classes.

Bring Your Own Device and wifi connections at school.

A number of students have brought machines to school to use on our wireless network which do NOT connect. The device must have 5GHz 802.11n wireless support to connect to the school wifi infrastructure. This may be advertised as "Dual Band Wireless", "802.11abgn", "802.11agn", "802.11ac" or "Gigabit Wireless".

Note: Devices marketed as "802.11bgn" do NOT support the standard required.

In the event that the device does not have the correct built-in wireless support, it is possible to buy a wireless adaptor (a small USB adaptor) that will allow connection to the 5GHz 802.11n system.

The Technology Support Officers (TSO's) located in the E block quadrangle can provide help for students if there are any questions.


