2016 in Review

2016 has continued the Killara High School tradition of busy excellence.

1633 students were educated at Killara High School this year. 287 Year 12 students graduated, and achieved some wonderful HSC results in 43 courses, which will be the front page story in the first newsletter of 2017.

These are the statistics that we all remember. However, it isn't the full picture of our year.

In 2016:

- students had their work chosen for the highly competitive InTech and ARTEXPRESS shows
- students travelled to Menindee and students from Menindee Central School visited us
- 24 students travelled to Cambodia and Vietnam to work with local communities, 8 students made our first trip to our newest sister school in Shanghai and 8 travelled to Germany as part of our longest sister school partnership
- Year 7 journeyed to Vision Valley, Year 9 to Stanwell Tops and Year
 11 to Jindabyne on our much-loved annual camps
- well over 200 students performed as part of our Performing Arts Ensembles in venues ranging from our local public schools, to Sydney Town Hall, Port Macquarie and Olympic Park
- many students completed a stage of the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme, with 14 achieving the prestigious Gold Award so far this year
- 275 students served the community in a week of service learning
- hundreds of students achieved High Distinction and Distinction Awards in academic competitions, with first places in NSW achieved in ICAS Writing, the United Nations Youth Voice competition and the national Mathematics Olympiad; students also represented NSW in the National Schools' Constitutional Convention, athletics, gymnastics.
- two students gained medals at the World Mathematics Olympiad
- students participated in the Youth Review Forum on Books of the Year, a pre-election debate with Deputy Prime Minister Barnaby Joyce, the Balmoral Burn, the Model United Nations Assembly, the inaugural North Shore 5 Symposium, the Premier's Debating Challenge, the Deli in the Park Art Competition and met with Dr Brendan Nelson to advocate for indigenous rights
- students placed first in the Ku-ring-gai Council Writing Competition and second in the NSW Boccia knockout
- over \$10 000 was raised for charity
- the whole school worked hard to reinforce our values of inclusivity, celebration of diversity and social justice through R U OK? Day, White Ribbon Day, Wear It Purple Day and others
- our school took first place in zone swimming, second place in zone cross country, and third place in zone athletics
- many teams were sporting premiers across the zone, and some across the region

- our school placed first in the North Shore Music Spectacular, performed in both the Ryde and the NSW Schools Spectacular, and we were highly commended at the Sydney Eisteddfod
- over 200 students nominated for leadership councils
- hundreds of students participated in clubs: coding, drawing, chess, dance, textiles, knitting, drama and many more

This isn't a complete list. It can't be, and I hope no-one is offended by any omissions. I have tried to take a snapshot of our year, which as is customary, is characterised by exceptional participation in academic, sporting, cultural and leadership pursuits. I want to take a moment to commend our exceptional staff, whose initiative, energy and care make these things happen. On that note, four permanent members of staff leave us next week.

The whole school wishes her a long, happy and healthy retirement.

Ms Mijakovac was appointed to Killara in 2001 and has served our students as a wonderful teacher of junior Science and Chemistry, as Year Adviser and as a relieving Head Teacher. Ms Mijakovac will reduce her commute significantly by this move, and we wish her and her family the very best.

Pittwater High School is also gaining an outstanding Mathematics teacher, Dr Christine McClean. Dr McClean has taught Mathematics at Killara High School for three years, and has involved herself in curriculum enrichment such as student camps and the KSP gifted and talented program. Dr Mc Clean has improved the school by carrying out gardening in the E block courtyard, and I will miss her Christmas decorations filling the trees!

Ms Gillian O'Connor has supported our school for a number of years as a temporary employee, teaching Visual Arts. She has also served as Producer on our most recent musical, *High School Musical*. Ms O'Connor has gained a permanent teaching position through merit selection at Newtown School of Performing Arts.

Food Tech. Excursion Report

Last Monday the senior Food Technology and Hospitality students visited the acclaimed Brasserie Bread (in Banksmeadow) to get BREDUCATED!

The students took part in the company's 'Breducation' program, where they were banqueted, left to indulge in freshly baked croissants, oozing with melted chocolate and warm gargantuan loaves of crusty sourdough. As much as I'd love to say that we spent our day feasting like royalty, eating a year's worth of carbs, the Breducation program encompasses so much more...

Touring the company's manufacturing area, we discovered the various processing and cooking techniques used by the company's bakers, when creating artisanal bread. Amongst this, they participated in a bread-making workshop, making scrolls and bread plaits.

When owner, Michael, was asked to comment on what he hopes to achieve with Breducation, he declared that the sole purpose was to 'revolutionise the way in which Australians eat bread (shifting the current 'bread culture') as part of a healthy,

balanced diet. It's about the 'quality and not quantity' of the bread. Artisanal bread is dearer, however, upon investigation, the quality (taste, texture, process and quality of the ingredients) of artisanal bread and its health benefits fulfil the extra cost.

For example, on comparison, a retail bought sourdough (purchased from a supermarket) may not guarantee you all the health benefits it claims to have, due to its manufacturing process. An artisanal sourdough can take 3 - 4days to make, whilst a retail-designed sourdough could take 1 - 2 hours.

Overall, it was a great day for both students and teachers, exploring the art of artisanal bread making in a 21st century-style production scene. To all future Hospitality and Food Technology students, I strongly recommend you to come along, it's scone to be a lot of fun, wheat loaf for you to come!
