From the Principal

You will probably be aware that some significant changes to the Higher School Certificate were announced by the Board of Studies Teaching and Educational Standards (BOSTES) NSW last week.

The reforms, *Stronger HSC Standards,* target three areas: minimum standards for literacy and numeracy, curriculum and assessment.

Minimum literacy and numeracy standards

To be eligible for the award of the HSC, students will be required to reach a minimum literacy and numeracy standard at the level of Band 8 in each of their Year 9 NAPLAN reading, writing and numeracy tests. Students who do not achieve Band 8 in their Year 9 NAPLAN tests can also achieve this minimum standard by passing online literacy and numeracy tests in Years 10, 11 or 12. Achieving this minimum standard will be a condition for Year 12 students to receive the HSC from 2020. Students with disabilities undertaking Life Skills courses, and students from a non-English speaking background who have been learning English for less than one year will be exempt from meeting the standard.

Students who do not reach the standard will receive the Record of School Achievement (RoSA). Students will also have five years after leaving school to meet the literacy and numeracy standard to receive an HSC.

Curriculum

BOSTES will review HSC course content every five years to ensure syllabuses remain relevant and current. The new English, Mathematics, Science and History syllabuses will be implemented for Year 11 students in 2018 and for Year 12 students in 2019. Students will also have the option of studying a new Science Extension course which will be implemented for Year 12 students in 2019.

Assessment

School-based assessment tasks will be capped at three per course in Year 11 and four per course in Year 12. The number of assessment tasks in each subject will be capped for Year 11 students in 2018 and Year 12 in 2019. The final HSC exams held in October and November each year will continue.

The nature of HSC exam questions will change to promote problem solving, application of skills and in-depth analysis. Sample exam questions for English, Mathematics, Science and History syllabuses will be available in 2017.

Mathematics courses, like English will be marked on a common scale. This common scaling will allow comparison of students studying at different levels. There will be common content in Mathematics for Year 11 students in 2018 and for Year 12 students in 2019. This common scale for Mathematics will apply for Year 12 students in 2019.
