Primary and High school students collaborate via video conference to discuss successful fundraising initiatives

Most people know what justice means, but when the two words go together, “social” and “justice” there’s a lot of confusion. If we were to sum up social justice in just one sentence here it is:

“Advocating for those who don’t have a voice in the pursuit of justice, purely for someone else’s sake”

The Social Justice Committee at Killara High School collaborates to make an impact within our school community and world. As a passionate body of students we strive to make a difference to the lives of people by initiating dialogue about human rights, discrimination and other significant injustices. One of our key goals is to raise awareness and change attitudes and behaviours through advocating for causes like extreme poverty, gender equality, animal welfare, the wellbeing and rights of the homeless, cancer and AIDS awareness, climate change and mental health issues.



A recent initiative of the Social Justice Committee was to participate in a video conference with the Killara Schools Partnership (KSP). The KSP aims to provide enrichment experiences, professional learning for teachers and a smooth transition to secondary education for primary students. Year 7 students Caitie Blandford, Jasmine Fattah, Anke Vermeulen and Year 9 student Inge Vermeulen observed the video conference, while Year 10 students Dan Leslie and Indira Courtness took part. We were pleased to have Year 12 student Sam Jacobs, who is the outgoing president of the SJC, lead the meeting.

Students from Roseville, Gordon East, Killara, Lindfield East, Lindfield and Beaumont Road Public Schools gathered to discuss and share ideas about strategies for the implementation of successful fundraising. Each school shared their fundraising ideas and together we explored how success is defined. The outcome of the recent Killara Schools Partnership meeting showed that successful fundraising is not only defined by how much money is raised but by how students work together for a common outcome, raising awareness in the school community through enjoyable and engaging fundraisers. The meeting also highlighted the autonomy the SJC at Killara High School has in comparison to the parent involvement in primary schools fundraising initiatives.

The SJC at Killara High provides an opportunity for like-minded students to work together to bring about change in our community. Together we can work towards a better future for those less fortunate and collectively have a stronger influence and voice for social justice. Our “lucky country” is currently the least generous it has ever been, yet we live in one of the wealthiest communities in Australia. How can we share what we have in abundance?

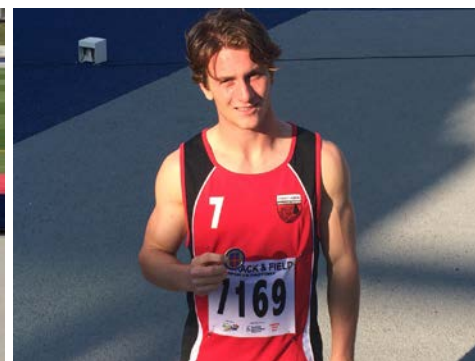
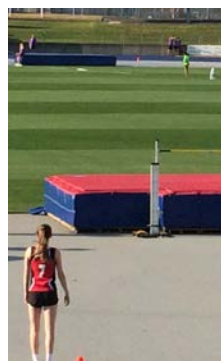
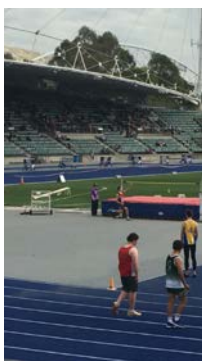
