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From the Principal

The 2016 Higher School Certificate again saw Killara High School students achieving outstanding results overall, with many particularly remarkable individual performances.

Our Dux is Jongmin Lim, who gained an ATAR of 99.4, and will study a Bachelor of Science degree (Advanced Mathematics) at the University of Sydney. Jongmin has also received the highly coveted Sydney Scholars' Award scholarship. Six students were among the state's highest All Round Achievers with band six (the highest band) or equivalent in ten or more units of study. These students were Alexis Edinburg, Jasmine Khor, Jim Ng, Lauren O'Hara, Greta Paget and Bethany Rodgers

Three students earned places on the merit lists. Ann Qian placed third in the state in Japanese Extension, Abby Constable fourth in Music 1 and Alexis Edinburg fourth in Visual Arts.

Overall 349 band six results were awarded to the cohort of 286 Killara High School students.

In the whole of NSW Mathematics merit lists, student achievement resulted in Killara High School gaining 15th place in Advanced and Extension Mathematics.

Of the 46 HSC courses studied at Killara High School last year, 33 had a course mean above the state average. Sixteen courses had a course mean of more than 5% above state average.

Ninety-three students, or 33% of the cohort, received an ATAR (Australian Tertiary Achievement Rank) of 90 or above. 18% achieved a rank of 95 or higher. This information represents the best of our knowledge, as ATARs are not provided directly to schools.

Killara High School placed 61st overall, out of all secondary schools in NSW. This is a testament to the commitment and talent of our Year 12 students, and their expert teachers.

To my mind, however, the most important fact is this – that the vast majority of our students gained a place in the tertiary course that they desired. Two hundred and sixty four UAC offers were made.

I congratulate Year 12 2016 on their admirable achievements. We are very proud of them.

In this work I wanted to explore traditional notions of life and death and the transience of being, using vanitas traditions of still life in the contemporary medium of photography. Birds are unique and beautiful creatures and my artwork expresses my deeply held respect for them. Close to Home is both literal and metaphorical in meaning: birds have a space close to my heart, and these native Australian birds are often seen near my house or in the bush nearby. The bottlebrush timber used - upon which the kookaburra and tawny frogmouth appear - has been cut from my own backyard, drawing meaning on a personal level. The laser cuts of a Carnaby's black cockatoo and a kingfisher use Australian Huon pine wood, highlighting aspects of land and place

From Turner's romantic landscape paintings to Sung Ho Lee's dreamlike video drawings. I've drawn on the extreme realism of forms to create a sense of soaring through a euphoric heaven beyond the clouds. Sung Ho Lee's use of unique pastel drawing techniques inspired my artistic practice, with the aim of giving 'pleasure and ease' to the eyes. The warmth of my work induces a heavenly feeling as you find yourself immersed in a virtual reality of the skies.

Killara High School and ScopeIT Education are teaming up again to continue our successful coding club-CIY.Club.

Students have the opportunity to be self-directed and motivated to work independently, with guidance from expert coaches. Like a Karate Class, where kids of all ages and skill levels come together to learn, train and improve we also use a leveling system similar to the belt system, where the kids complete a certain number of achievements before they can 'Level Up' to reach their next level. We provide the kids coloured armbands to denote their level instead of a belt.

This program matches Killara High School's key strategic direction that aims to develop successful learners.

Macbook Air laptops will be provided for use during the program.
