Killara High School is celebrating the life of a much-loved teacher, Ms Julie Phelan, who passed away recently.

Ms Phelan was first appointed to Killara as a Mathematics teacher in 1974. It is fair to say that the school became her second home. While she spent six years in other positions with the Department of Education, the remainder of Ms Phelan's long career was devoted to the students of Killara High School.

We were delighted when Ms Phelan returned to us in 2008 in the newlycreated position of Stage 4 Head Teacher. She made this role her own, caring for every student. Ms Phelan was particularly conscious of the needs of our newest students as they entered Year 7, and she implemented many programs to support them as they made the move from primary school. Many Year 7 parents reconnected with Julie at Orientation Day, where they were delighted to see that Ms Phelan, who taught them during their own years at KHS, was here to welcome their children.

Ms Phelan's legacy is enormous. Killara High School has received hundreds of messages, all praising her ability to connect with every student. Past and present staff, students and parents speak of extra lessons provided at lunchtime, her tireless efforts with camps and excursions, the fact that she never missed a school play or concert, and overwhelmingly, that she was a true inspiration to so many. One comment particularly resonates: Ms Phelan didn't just teach Maths, she taught the power of believing in yourself, the value of generosity and the benefit of hard work.

Julie Phelan was a born teacher. We have been fortunate to have benefitted from talent and expertise for so many years. Our students learned the importance of care and compassion from her, and we are so very grateful for her.

## **School Travel Update**

#### Information for parents, guardians and students

Our school has partnered with Transport for NSW to use the new online School Portal for endorsing school travel applications.

You are now able to manage all your school travel needs online including applying for school travel passes and tracking the status of your application.

The application process has also been simplified so that a new or updated application for school travel passes is only needed when a student is:

- applying for a school travel pass for the first time
- requesting an additional pass as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).
- changing school or campus
- changing home address
- receiving an expiry notification

- repeating a school year
- changing their name
- requesting a new transport operator.

This means students who are progressing to Year 3 and Year 7 only need to reapply if they are changing circumstances.

Students who are not residents and are temporarily in Australia can also provide their visa subclass number and exchange program (if prompted) when applying online, making the application and approval process much faster.
