Killara Schools Partnership Video Conference -A discussion about our favourite school activities

The Social Justice Committee (SJC) at Killara High School collaborates to make an impact within our school community and the world around us. Students from Roseville, Gordon East, Killara, Lindfield East, Lindfield and Beaumont Road Public Schools gathered to discuss and share activities their school holds. Each school shared their favourite school activities and had the opportunity to ask questions in relation to the topic. A range of favourite activities were shared by the primary schools. Some common examples were Year 6 fairs, school camps, Year 6 dinner dances, discos, school carnivals and musicals. The Social Justice Committee members present shared and answered questions on our favourite school events which included the music nights, school camps for Years 7, 9 and 11, sports carnivals, the Swim and Survive program and the World's Greatest Shave.

An outcome of the recent Killara Schools Partnership meeting included giving the primary school students involved an insight into life at Killara High School. Another key outcome included raising awareness in the school community that it is possible to plan and execute enjoyable and engaging fundraisers, like the World's Greatest Shave, as a team of students committed to seeking justice and serving the community in a constructive and productive way. During weeks 8 and 9 Year 7 Visual Arts classes visited the Art Gallery of NSW over three inspiring days.

Studying the unit *Portraiture: Difference and Diversity,* the students viewed the Archibald Prize to see first-hand the range of approaches happening in contemporary portrait painting in Australia. Some lucky students happened to be in the right place at the right time and were fortunate enough to see this year's winner Mitch Cairns stand in front of his work *Agatha Gothe-Snape* and speak about his art making practice.

Students discussed artworks they loved and artworks they did not, as well as portraits that challenged their
