From the Principal

It's hard to believe we are almost halfway through Term 2. Being the busy place that it is, time at Killara High School seems to defy the laws of physics and move at a different pace.

Since the last newsletter, NAPLAN has come and gone, three Duke of Edinburgh groups have hiked, and ensembles have dazzled at the Sydney Opera House, the Sydney Town Hall, the North Shore High Schools Music Festival, and the Sydney North Dance Festival auditions. Five excursions have enriched student learning and a highly successful Arts Council mufti day was held, raising money to support The Australian Children's Music Foundation. The Sports Council helped Year 7 capture the flag, with Kimba being the successful house, the Bill Turner soccer team are through to the third round, and the Boccia team won their round of competition. Students were successful in debating against North Sydney Boys' High School, and competed with distinction at the NSW Table Tennis Challenge Cup. Evenings have provided ample entertainment also, with a very well-attended Student Progress Review Meeting held on Wednesday, and a study skills seminar for parents last night.

We enjoyed working with students from our partner primary schools in a Visual Arts workshop, Peer Support continues with Year 7 and 11, and Year 12 students have attended a number of university information sessions here at school. Peer tutoring continues to grow, and there are exciting refurbishments happening in the Lion Library. Our students are operating a successful café, and are advocating for real change both locally – researching new uniform options – and globally, in terms of the environmental focus on our usage of disposable items.

When we also consider the ongoing development of our new building and renovation plans for the canteen, and the usual work of actual teaching and learning ... Killara is a pretty dynamic place to be. The work of the P&C Association at present is extensive, and very much appreciated.

Student Progress Review Meetings – Years 10 and 11

Each year Killara High School schedules three student progress review meetings when parents can speak with teachers about their child's learning progress before too much of the year has passed.

We have scheduled the third Student Progress Review meeting session for Years 10 and 11 during Term 2 on **Tuesday 19 June – Term 2 Week 8.**

We hope parents can take advantage of this opportunity to discuss with teachers their children's progress to date.

Interview Bookings

Interviews between parents and the nominated teachers will then be scheduled between the hours of 3.30pm and 8.00pm taking into account parent and teacher availability.

The schedule of interviews will be open for parent access on 29 May, when parents will receive log on codes and your preferences can be entered. The website will close at 8.00am on Thursday 7 June to generate schedules. The site will reopen on Tuesday 12 June for parents to make some limited adjustments, depending on the availability of teachers and download the schedule. This access will close again on Monday 18 June at 3.00pm, and no changes will be possible after this time.

PLEASE NOTE -

- The system does not notify you of your appointment schedule. You must log on between 12 18 June to download your interview appointments.
- The venue for all interviews will be the Kerrabee Centre hall. Signs around the walls of the hall will indicate course/faculty locations and signs on tables will indicate locations of individual teachers.
- Interviews are of five minutes duration. Parents and teachers are asked to restrict their discussion to that time in fairness to all families seeking interviews. If teachers and/or parents feel the need to discuss matters further, another mutually convenient time should be arranged.
- Interviews must be prearranged. To drop in on the off chance of speaking to a teacher can prove very frustrating to those with appointments and such requests may not be able to be accommodated. Please give consideration to the needs of other parents and the staff during these evenings.
- School stream and Compass reminders will be sent for this event. Please ensure that your login details are up to date for these apps.

Please take advantage of these opportunities to meet with the school staff to discuss your child's progress. Year Advisers, Career Adviser and a School Counsellor will also be present. A translation service can also be made available through the school. Please notify the office by email at killara-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au if you require this service. You will need to indicate your child's language required and approximate times of interviews.

Higher School Certificate and Stage 5 Course Information Meeting For Parents of Years 8 and 10 Students

Information sessions for parents of students in Year 8 and 10 will be held on:

Tuesday 12 June 2018 in the Kerrabee Theatre Year 8 at 6.00pm and Year 10 at 6.45pm

In order to provide students and parents with comprehensive information to assist in decision making about programs of study for Year 9 and Year 11 2019, course information booklets will be distributed to students prior to the information evening.

These booklets contain general information about Higher School Certificate and Stage 5 course requirements as well as details about all subjects on offer to students. Killara High School is able to offer students a very broad range of courses for both the Higher School Certificate and Stage 5.

The meetings on Tuesday 12 June will provide parents and students with further details about the NSW Education Standards Authority (NESA) requirement for the awards of the Record of School Achievement and Higher School Certificate.

All faculties will have representatives available at the evening information sessions to provide additional information about courses.

Students are asked to choose their courses carefully in consultation with parents and teachers. Year 8 students choose two electives to study in Year 9. Year 10 students choose 10 units (most subjects are equal to 2 units) in addition to the compulsory 2 units of English. Students are always advised to make their choices based on their interests and talents.

Killara High School provides a supportive consultation process to ensure all students make choices that will best suit their individual needs. For Year 10, all students will be interviewed in June by either a Stage Head Teacher or Careers Adviser prior to finalising their course selections for their senior program of study.

Both Year 8 and Year 10 students will be required to return their selection forms before the end of Term 2.

Student Safety

Please note that Department of Education policy requires supervision of students to commence 30 minutes before the start of the school day. Consequently, the school is not open to students before 8.10am, except for those attending lessons or practices under the supervision of a teacher.

Students arriving before Home Group are expected to remain within the school grounds where they are supervised informally by the large numbers of teachers arriving or present at that time. Students may not leave the school grounds after their arrival at school without written authority of the school and knowledge of parents/carers.

At the conclusion of the day the large numbers of students leaving school by bus are supervised by rostered staff until all buses have departed. All other students must leave the school premises following the 3.05pm bell. There is no formal supervision provided in the school grounds after school.

Killara Schools Partnership Visual Arts Workshop

On Thursday 17 May, twenty Year 4 students came from KSP primary schools, Killara Public, Beaumont Road Public and Lindfield East Public Schools to participate in an art workshop run by Ms Sherras at Killara High School. The program taught them printmaking techniques and skills for printing artworks using coloured inks and a printing press. Ms Sherras was assisted during the workshop by Year 8 students, Nicholas Thompson, Jessica Lee and David Cooper who helped the Year 4 students with their printmaking procedures.

The students arrived at nine o'clock in the morning and were given some inspirational images and an explanation of what they would achieve during the workshop. This was followed by detailed instructions and a demonstration of the process. The students then began their fabulous artworks.

They rolled their coloured ink onto their printing plates, put their plants and stencils on the plates and started to print with the printing press.

Everyone had an amazing time and learned skills to help them in the future such as following a detailed procedure, safely using specialised equipment and thinking creatively to create a unique finished product. The students were well behaved and produced great artworks including prints of leaves, plants and silhouettes of insects and birds. Their best prints will be showcased at the upcoming Killara High School art show from 31 August.

Parking and road rules in school zones


You need to take extra care when driving and parking in school zones. Make sure that you and your child understand the road rules. If you break the traffic rules in a school zone you are putting not only your child but other children at risk. The parking and traffic rules around our schools are there to protect your children. If you break the rules you will be fined. **Please choose safety over convenience.**



QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE TO IMPORTANT SAFETY TRAFFIC RULES					
ZONE	WHAT DOES IT MEAN?	WHY IS IT THERE?	PENALTY	DEMERIT POINTS*	
NO STOPPING	You cannot stop in a NO STOPPING zone for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space).	Keeps clear sight lines between drivers and children / pedestrians.	\$330	(School Zone) 2	
	You can stop in a NO PARKING zone for a maximum of 2 minutes to drop off and pick up passengers. If no spaces are available you cannot queue on the road way or in any other zones while waiting for a space. You will need to drive away and park elsewhere, only returning when there is space to pull up. You must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle at all times and cannot leave your vehicle unattended.	Provides a safe place for children / pedestrian set down and pick up.	\$183	(School Zone) 2	
BUS ZONE	You must not stop or park in a BUS ZONE for any reason (including queuing or waiting for a space) unless you are driving a bus. If times are shown on the sign, you are not allowed to stop during those times.	Provides a safe place for large buses to set down and pick up school children.	\$330	(School Zone) 2	
	You must not stop on or within 20 metres before a PEDESTRIAN CROSSING or 10 metres after a crossing unless there is a sign permitting parking.	So drivers can clearly see pedestrians on the crossing.	\$439	(School Zone) 2	
X	DOUBLE PARKING You must not stop on the road adjacent to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers.	Double parking blocks visibility and forces other cars to go around you.	\$330	(School Zone) 2	
X 45	You must not stop on any FOOTPATH or NATURE STRIP, or on, or across a DRIVEWAY.	You could easily run over a child or force pedestrians onto the road to get around you.	\$330	(School Zone) 2
