

# From the Principal

At this time of year many of us are thinking about curriculum. Year 8 and Year 10 are about to select subjects for their next stage of study, and I remind their families that the Subject Selection Evening is next Tuesday, June 12. This evening offers the opportunity to speak to staff across all key learning areas about courses, so please make a note of it.

The key piece of advice I'd like to emphasise to all students is this: choose courses in which you have an interest. Two years is a long time to pursue the study of something that you do not enjoy. Subject decisions made on the basis of friends' choices simply don't make sense. Likewise, be honest in evaluating your skills. Stage 6 courses involve a new level of complexity, and require a solid foundation of knowledge in order to see success.

Teachers are focused also on the cross-curricular, inquiry-based course that will be introduced to the Year 10 curriculum from 2019. This course will focus on developing skills and knowledge in problem solving, team work and project management, specifically to help students thrive in Stage 6 and beyond. New HSC syllabuses focus strongly on the application of critical and creative thinking, design, and obtaining and analysing information. It is important to establish these skills, but also to help the dispositions that today's workplaces value: flexibility, collaboration, communication and initiative. Watch this space for updates on course development.

Today's R U OK? Day, organised by our prefects, not only raised a significant sum of money for the R U OK? Organisation and the Humpty Dumpty Foundation, but also served as a reminder that we are a strong community, soundly based in a culture of care for each other. I am so proud of the work that our students do to nurture the wellbeing of everyone. The key message of R U OK? is to remind us to look out for each other, and to start a conversation if we think that things are not going well with them. #### **Interview Bookings**

Interviews between parents and the nominated teachers will then be scheduled between the hours of 3.30pm and 8.00pm taking into account parent and teacher availability.

The schedule of interviews opened for parent access on 29 May, when parents received log on codes and your preferences can be entered. The website closed at 8.00am on Thursday 7 June to generate schedules. The site will reopen on Tuesday 12 June for parents to make some limited adjustments, depending on the availability of teachers and download the schedule. This access will close again on Monday 18 June at 3.00pm, and no changes will be possible after this time.

#### PLEASE NOTE -

• The system does not notify you of your appointment schedule. You must log on between 12 - 18 June to download your interview appointments.

• The venue for all interviews will be the Kerrabee Centre hall. Signs around the walls of the hall will indicate course/faculty locations and signs on tables will indicate locations of individual teachers.

• Interviews are of five minutes duration. Parents and teachers are asked to restrict their discussion to that time in fairness to all families seeking interviews. If teachers and/or parents feel the need to discuss matters further, another mutually convenient time should be arranged.

• Interviews must be prearranged. To drop in on the off chance of speaking to a teacher can prove very frustrating to those with appointments and such requests may not be able to be accommodated. Please give consideration to the needs of other parents and the staff during these evenings.

• School stream and Compass reminders will be sent for this event. Please ensure that your login details are up to date for these apps.

Please take advantage of these opportunities to meet with the school staff to discuss your child's progress. Year Advisers, Career Adviser and a School Counsellor will also be present. A translation service can also be made available through the school. Please notify the office by email at <u>killara-h.school@det.nsw.edu.au</u> if you require this service. You will need to indicate your child's language required and approximate times of interviews.

# Model United Nations Assembly (MUNA)



On 19 and 20 this month, six students (Daisy Cheesman, Kate Aston, Callum Ward and Katia Fenton of Year 11, and Esha Sinha and Timothy Fikh of Year 10) represented Killara High School at the Rotary Model United Nations Assembly (MUNA). The two-day debating competition consisted of forty-two teams from numerous schools who had been assigned countries, or 'delegations' that they were to represent. Our school entered two teams of three students, of which the delegations of India and the Solomon Islands were represented.

The mock General Assembly is run by a Secretary General, and the weekend is spent engaging in argumentative discussion about six pre-determined resolutions. This year the resolutions covered issues of deep-space exploration. extra-terrestrial visitation. genetically-modified crops, euthanasia, the Israel-Palestine conflict, and the veto-power of some UN Security Council members. All of the delegations must argue in alignment with the policies, beliefs and interests of the country they are representing, regardless of their own views, which made for some fruitful and controversial debate.

The six students spent many mornings before school researching and preparing for the weekend. We are also especially grateful for the Lindfield and Ku-ring-gai Rotary Clubs for sponsoring our teams to attend the event, and would like to thank Mr and Mrs Sinha for providing beautiful traditional Indian dress for us to wear at the competition.

Overall, MUNA was a very valuable experience, encouraging critical thinking and understanding through the lens of world politics, and strengthening impromptu and compelling debating skills. The Killara High School students came away with many stories to tell and many friends made.

# **3D Printing in TAS**

This year Miss Tonia Bell and Mr Owen Telfer introduced Year 8 Technology Mandatory students to the use of 3D Printers. The assignment was to create a unique cover for a USB circuit. Students were introduced to an online CAD package TinkerCAD, and began modelling their ideas. After going through the design process, students 3D printed their final chosen design.



3D printing technology benefits education as it positions students as creators. Instead of buying or consuming the creations of someone else, they become the inventors and enhance their critical thinking abilities through problem solving. 3D printing has had an amazing impact on how we teach Technology Mandatory (Stage 4), Industrial Multimedia and Design Technology and Technology. It gives you a tiny manufacturing plant and prototyping tool right inside your classroom, which Killara High students can use to bring their imaginations to life.
