From the Principal

Welcome back to school. Term 3 is always exciting, although Year 11 and 12 may have a different view, given that they are sitting and preparing for examinations.

The use of mobile phones in schools has been frequently discussed in the media and other arenas. The NSW Government's recent decision to review the use of smartphones in schools with a view to a possible ban in primary schools has been welcomed by many.

At Killara High School we do not ban mobile phones. There are a couple of reasons behind this decision. The first is that most families wish their child to have a phone for reasons of safety and security. While we could institute a plan that separates students from their phone during the day, the administrative and financial burden this would place on a school this size would be significant.

Secondly, we regard teaching and modelling the responsible use of technology as part of our job. It's important to educate children to live well in their time, and their time is technology-rich. We are also committed to helping students develop the digital maturity and integrity they will need in the workplace. Mobile phones are ubiquitous; pretending they don't exist within the school gates is not preparing young people for the society in which they will live.

We recognise that some students can be distracted by their phones in the classroom. To this end, we have a strictly enforced mobile phone policy, which is issued to all students in the Student Diary. This policy states that mobile phones must not be used during class time without the express permission of the teacher. If a student misuses a mobile phone, a warning is given in the first instance. Should there be a second occasion of misuse, the student is referred to the relevant Head Teacher for an appropriate consequence. Teachers may also confiscate mobile phones during the school day.

We regularly review policies in the school, and we welcome your views.

The plans for our new building are progressing. We were very pleased to learn of the decision to include air conditioning in new school buildings, and the discussions around possible designs are very productive. I'm confident that the final result will be a facility that allows students to learn in a multitude of ways. As soon as building commences we will establish a section on the school website to keep everyone informed. At present, the government provides information on this site:

Year 3 Science Workshop at Killara High School

On 31 July, Year 3 students from Killara, Lindfield, Lindfield East, Beaumont Road and Roseville Public Schools came for an exciting day of science to Killara High School to participate in a science extension workshop. There were many fascinating experiments at the workshop.

One the most popular experiment was the Wizard's Brew, which explored how different chemical reacted with each other. The experiment consisted of using bicarbonate of soda and vinegar to create a reaction that imitates a volcano. We used food dye to change the colour of the reaction.

Another engaging experiment was the density tower, which involved exploring the density of different liquids. The students poured detergent, water, oil and

methylated spirited into a measuring cylinder. All the substances layered according to their density.

Microscopes were another interesting activity as it included observing cells and living things. The scientific microscopes used were to observe the cell samples of an oesophagus and onion skin.

It was an enjoyable day for both the Year 3 students and Year 8 and 9 Killara High School students who mentored the younger students in this science workshop.





You must not stop on or within 20 metres before a PEDESTRIAN CROSSING or 10 metres after a crossing unless there is a sign permitting parking.
